2. Enhancing your teaching skills and pedagogy: half-day workshops delivered by MFL specialists at Queen Mary's High School on a monthly basis covering the following areas:

- New KS3 and KS4 Specifications and the MFL Curriculum
- The use of authentic material in the MFL classroom (films, music, poetry...)
- How to teach grammar efficiently and confidently
- The use of target language and developing strategies for spontaneous talk in the classroom
- Planning and delivering high quality lessons in MFL
- Certificate provided for the workshops attended
- Some cover cost will be available to enable you to attend the workshops
