

Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economic Education (PSHCEE)

Key Stage 4 Curriculum Overview

PSHCEE is taught solely through the provision of two Drop Down Days per year group. All students will spend these days off timetable and working through a range of PSHCEE workshops. These are delivered by a mixture of school staff as well as external agencies. All of these sessions are carefully planned to meet the needs of our students and inform them of important topics in an age appropriate way.

The specific workshops differ slightly every year due to internal staffing and external workshop providers. The planned content is reviewed each year and adjusted to meet school aims as well as government guidance. Below is the planned content for 2018-19:

Year 10

- **Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) and grooming, focusing on recognising the signs and where to get help.**
- **Healthy and unhealthy relationships with a specific focus on recognising the signs of grooming within a relationship and how to get help for yourself or someone you know.**
- **The introduction of UniFrog for completing a CV and careers search.**
- **Knife crime rates, the law and where to go for help.**
- **Mental Health including coping strategies and how to develop positive mental health.**
- **Presentation by the Teenage Cancer Trust.**
- **Finance education including debt management.**

Year 11

- **Life in the sixth form and A Level subject choices.**
- **The introduction of UniFrog for completing a CV and careers search.**
- **Mental Health including self-esteem and exam stress.**
- **Interview preparation.**
- **Careers talks.**
- **LGBT rights and discrimination.**
